Of particular interest is the discovery of two previously unknown sons who died before reaching adulthood, and details on the lives of Esq. Albert N. Mills and Judge John R. Mills, youngest sons of William Nelson and Ann Leap Mills. Stories of a personal nature were found in newspaper articles written as they married, ran for public office, advertised business deals, or memorialized a loved one taken too soon in death. You will enjoy learning even more about our ancestors in the Addendum. Genealogy research is never really done!



We identified some of the lots our Mills and Leap ancestors owned in Alexandria, VA. We located their graves in historic Presbyterian Cemetery and in the graveyard at Christ Church. It was an awesome experience to walk in the same places they lived so long ago.

Williamsburg was breathtakingly beautiful with the first blush of spring flowers and dogwoods in bloom. I highly recommend this as a destination for kids' summer vacations, or an immersion into our country's colonial history. It had particular meaning for Peggy & me because our Mills ancestors attended the College of William & Mary there.

Also, two pieces of needlework stitched in 1797 by our 3rd great-grandmother, Ann Leap Mills, are in the Dewitt Museum in Williamsburg. I was privileged to see it in person inside the vault.

The land our ancestor, Richard Nelson owned at Mattawoman Creek (in 1695) is now part of the Smallwood State Park in Charles County, MD. We toured the house (now restored) Gen. Smallwood built in 1760. The original bricks were re-fired and used in the restoration of his house.

In Upper Marlboro, MD, we toured the house I was born in. James Christmas, a North Carolina lumber baron, built it as a summer house about 1885. After many years of neglect, the current owners bought it and restored it to its original magnificence. My history started in that house!

On a personal note: my knitted afghan was awarded first place and best of show at the Texas State Fair in September 2008.

Peggy Brennan was fortunate to go on a once-ina-lifetime trip to Jordan last summer. 
